

SUBJECT: Year 9 Music (Creative Technology) - Autumn Term

Topic	<p><b>Film Music</b></p> <p>Through the activities of this unit pupils will be introduced to compositional ideas associated with film music. They will learn about creating atmospheric music with regard to chord structures and melodic / scalar patterns. They will compose and perform music that matches exact timings with a short extract of film. Pupil's harmonic skills will be developed, using an increased chordal range including minor chords. Pitch reading skills will also be developed and pupils understanding of the history, background and stylistic features of Film music. They will also carry out listening activities to consolidate their knowledge of film music.</p>	<p><b>Latin American Music</b></p> <p>Through the activities of this unit pupils will be introduced to the music of Latin America. They will learn about the history of the music and then listen to examples of different types of music. Groups will do research based on a particular type of Music from Latin America.</p> <p>Pupil will then go onto perform a piece of Samba music, within this there will be the opportunity to compose and improvise. Pupils listening skills will be developed using music throughout the project. Pupils rhythmic skills will be developed using the performance task and preparatory tasks before this.</p>

Topic	<p><b>Music Technology</b></p> <p>Through the activities of this unit pupils will be introduced to Music ICT and how ICT can be used to compose Music. They will learn how people in the music industry can use samples to create a track. They will learn how to make music effective using layering of samples over one another as well as using genre specific ideas such as panning. They will compose music using a pop form structure.</p> <p>Pupil's will learn about terms used in Music ICT and put these into practice in their final practical exercise. Pupils will select specific samples to go with their own piece. They will also carry out listening activities to consolidate their knowledge of music ICT.</p>	<p><b>Song Writing</b></p> <p>Through the activities of this unit pupils will develop their own knowledge of pop. In this unit pupils will learn about the history and structure of pop and use Chords, Riffs and melodies to make a song. They will perform their song to the class and therefore develop their performing skills. They will then appraise their own and others work.</p>

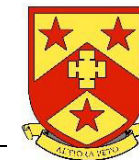
