


Induction Days

This will not generate a direct response, but queries will be collated into a FAQ before the end of term. If needed, (due to the specific nature of your query) your email will be forwarded to the relevant member of staff for their attention.

Absence / Truancy Call

Nether Stowe operates an automatic communication system that will contact you directly if your child is marked absent at registration. This will ensure that the reason for the absence is known as soon as possible and will alert you if your child is not in school when they should be.

A phone call should be made to the school if your child is away or late to registration. Alternatively, contact can be made to attendance@netherstowe.com. If there is no reason for the absence the above system will be operated.

Your child will be automatically included on the system.

By introducing this service, our school is able to reassure you that we are meeting the Government's recommendations in contacting you on the first day of your child's absence. It will also provide an early warning system if your child should go missing from school. As always your child's safety is paramount.

Our Attendance Office, Mrs Goodman, as well as members of the Pastoral Team, are always happy to discuss concerns around attendance and support in getting your child to school.

Top 10 myths about secondary school

- 1. I won't make friends. You will spend the first day of term just with Year 7 and there will be lots of fun activities that your tutor will organise to help you to get to know other people.
- 2. I'll get lost. We expect you to get lost in the first few weeks so don't worry. There are always students and members of staff on the corridors to help. You will also get a tour of the school with your Form Tutor on your first day. Nether Stowe is quite a small site, so you will quickly get to know your way around.
- 3. I'll have lots of homework. You will be introduced to your Knowledge Organisers, which will be used to support Home Learning. There is also a Study Club after school where you can do your home learning and get help if you need it.
- 4. I won't be able to do the work. Check you understand the work in the lesson, use your Knowledge Organiser and if you are not sure ask your teacher that's what they are there for. You can always go to Study Club too!
- 5. I might not get to school on time. If you have a long walk, bus or train journey then you could practise your journey over the summer holidays with your parents or a friend. You could also arrange to meet up with friends and come together.
- 6. I'll forget books or equipment. Use your timetable to help you get organised and make sure you have all the right equipment in your school bag. The best time to do this is the night before school—then you won't have to rush in the morning and forget something!
- 7. I'll get into trouble. If you listen and follow instructions then there is no reason to get into trouble. Sometimes we make mistakes and that can't be helped—your teachers make mistakes too!
- 8. I won't know my new teachers. The teachers at Nether Stowe are really friendly and because it's a small school they will get to know you really quickly even if they don't teach you. Some of your teachers you may only see once or twice a week.

- 9. I won't know what to do if there's a problem. If you have any problems you can talk to your Form Tutor, a Student from the Senior Team or any member of staff you feel comfortable talking to. You can also come to the Pastoral Office before or after school at break time or lunch time—there is always someone there who will listen. We will show you where key staff are in September.
- 10. I'll be bullied. If you feel you are being bullied then you should let some one know straight away. Don't let it carry on—it will be dealt with straight away. Again you can talk to your Form Tutor, a Student from the Senior Team or any member of staff you feel comfortable talking to. You can also come to the Pastoral Office at any time.

We also have a Senior Student Team who are ready to help you out so there is nothing to worry about.

Everyone wants you to settle in quickly and make lots of new friends. We want you to be the best you can be and if anything gets in the way of that we can help. You only have to ask.

If you have a problem you simply go to the Pastoral office or find a Buddy and let them know what the problem is and it will be sorted out quickly.

What equipment will I need?



A school bag will be really important. Make sure it is big enough to carry all the books you need for the day's lessons as well as your pencil case and water bottle.

It is a good idea to have a bag for your P.E. kit too.

You will need pens, pencils and a ruler for nearly every lesson. You would also find coloured crayons and highlighters useful. It would be a good idea to keep all these safe in a pencil case.

You must have as a minimum:

- 2 Black Pens
- Compass & Protractor
- Pencil
- Sharpener

- Eraser and 15cm Ruler
- Green Pen
- Scientific Calculator
- Water Bottle







If you would like to hire a locker you will be able to do so. This means you can keep your P.E. kit safe until you need it, or put some of your books or your outside coat in there instead of carrying them around for the whole day. Complete the form and a locker will be ready for you in September.

School Reward Shop:

You will receive Credits for all your hard work and effort in school and extra-curricular activities.

You can spend these in the Reward Shop to buy: equipment, cake or drink vouchers, footballs, water bottles.



Uniform & P.E. Kit

At Nether Stowe, your uniform is an important part of our identity and college. We expect all students to wear their uniform with pride.

Our uniform is:

- Black blazer with school badge to be worn at all times
- White shirt with collar which buttons to the neck
- Black skirt <u>must be knee length</u> and not be of a tight-fitting style or material;
 OR black trousers must be plain, formal and of an office style with no visible zips
- Black V-neck knitted sweater (optional) plain and long sleeved
- School College tie clip on type which must always be worn
- Dark socks or plain tights
- Shoes (boys and girls) plain black and leather style in appearance, all shoes must have a heel (less than 2.5cm)
- Coat (not a hooded top) which should be plain and dark

For P.E. you will need:

- Plain black shorts /skort with school badge
- Plain white short-sleeved polo shirt with school badge
- White sports socks
- Football boots and shin pads (for football and rugby lessons)
- Swimsuit/swim shorts towel and swimming hat
- Trainers (not pumps/Converse/Vans/Hi tops)

Expectations regarding school uniform will be strictly enforced.

For optional items of PE kit please refer to attached uniform list

Things to remember:

- We do not wear training shoes in school only for P.E.
- Trousers must be school trousers not fashion trousers that look like leggings or jeans
- Skirts must be knee length and not be of a tight fitting style or material
- No nail varnish or false nails
- No extreme haircuts or styles (boys must be grade 2 or longer)

What will my day be like?

The Nether Stowe day starts at 8:35 when the bell will ring and you will go to your form room for registration with your form tutor. This will last for 30 minutes.
